Aims and Objectives in Spending PE and Sports Premium

- To ensure that all pupils receive high quality coaching in all aspects of PE and Games
- To up skill staff through CPD opportunities to deliver high quality PE provision.
- To ensure that every child from 3 years old upwards has the opportunity to feel confident in the water, learn to swim and learn simple life saving tasks.
- To ensure that every child is provided with a range of extracurricular and enrichment activities and signpost more able, gifted and talented sports men and women to clubs and other opportunities to extend their abilities.
- To ensure that all pupils experience competition and /or sporting festivals and are challenged to improve their own performance in a range of sports and outdoor pursuits.
- To ensure that all pupils have a good understanding of what a healthy life style looks like and how to develop healthy life styles (physical and mental) and behaviours for life.

Type of provision provided:

- **Provision of high quality PE coaching through our partnership with Staindrop School PE department and specialist PE staff, to support our school in meeting the outcomes of the government's Strategy for School PE and Sport.**
 - Bespoke support provided by Staindrop School will include:
 - One hour each week of coaching at school for a whole year.
 - Termly festivals and competitions with cluster schools.

- **Provision of high quality PE and Sporting opportunities in partnership with Teesdale Leisure Centre (includes transport costs, hire of pool, swimming coach, additional school staff):**
 - Weekly swimming lessons for all pupils all year (half termly rotation)

- **Access to high quality sporting competitions through our partnership with School Games organization:**
 - Attendance at Level 2 School Games (Swimming gala, Cross country running, Sport Hall Athletics, Cricket)
 - Hosting Level 1 Intra school School Games (Cross Country, Cycling)
 - Purchased new goal posts
 - Improvements to gym equipment to comply with health and safety regulations

- **New acoustic sound proofing in school hall to enable all pupils to access facility, including pupils with aversion to loud environments.(£7,000)**

- **Improvements in outdoor learning and play to develop children's emotional and physical health and well-being.**

Monitoring and Impact Measures

- Every pupil in school attends and actively participates in at least one intra school sporting event and /or festival during the year.

- Every pupil in school attends and activity participates in at least one inter schools sporting competition and/or festival during the year.
- Pupils attend competitions to develop their competitive and sporting skills and talents.
- Every pupil receives swimming lessons throughout primary school. Tracker shows progress on a termly basis.
- Termly updates to school governors at Curriculum and Standards Committee Meetings.
- Updates to all governors at Full Governors Meetings (see Head Teacher Reports)
- Governor with Special Responsibility for Outdoor Play and Sports Premium visits to school to monitor use and impact of Sports and PE Premium Grant. Provide monitoring reports.
- Monthly monitoring of PE and Sports Grant from school budget by HT and DHT.
- Achievement of OPAL Award and end of year evaluation report
